This year we were able to submit receipts totaling \$1224 to the State for reimbursement. THANK YOU and continue to submit those gas receipts!!

FACTS AND FIGURES

According to the DOT traffic counter which was set up on trail C5 across from the groomer barn last season, that section of trail saw 287 sleds in the busiest hour, 2049 sleds on the busiest day, and 35,048 sleds for the season. That's a lot of traffic for a less than stellar snow year. We hope to have the counter back for the upcoming season.

In order to keep the trails as smooth as possible, last season the club logged 605 grooming hours, traveled 3,327 miles and used approximately 2,570 gallons of fuel to groom our 42 miles of trails.

GROOMERS

After over 3 years of work on the RTP grant process, we received our new Pisten Bully groomer in January and were able to put nearly 300 hours on it before the end of the season.

We also purchased a new drag for it which arrived in late February. So far it has performed well and will help us to keep the trails in the best shape we can.

We have since sold our BR180 and our oldest drag. Both went to clubs in New York State.

Our tucker underwent an extensive and costly rebuild last summer and came back tightened up and looking good. All the work done to it provided a breakdown free season.

Both machines have been cleaned up and summer service work will begin shortly.

We are currently in the process of applying for another RTP grant and will know if we were successful sometime in December.
